Local 6020 endorses your legislative efforts under Senate Bill 314 to add to Florida state statute 112.1815, requiring employing agencies of first responders to pay for licensed mental health counselling for first responders who request it. Senate Bill 314 seeks to prevent employing agencies of first responders from requiring the use of the first responder's own leave accruals to attend mental health counseling sessions.

First responders throughout the course of their careers respond to and see some of the most horrific moments society unfortunately endures. The nature of what first responders encounter during their careers is devastating and can be mentally and emotionally exhausting. With it being well documented that first responders have higher suicide rates than the general public, it is imperative that they have the resources and support necessary for their own wellbeing.
