The International Union of Police Associations (I.U.P.A.) Local 6020, the union representing the Department of Law Enforcement Deputies and Sergeants for the Broward County Sheriff's Office, currently represents approximately 1200 members. The I.U.P.A. Local 6020 endorses your legislative efforts in Senate Bill 354 to amend Florida state statute 893.135. Senate Bill 354 seeks to increase the minimum term of imprisonment for an offender trafficking in 4 grams of more but less than 14 grams from 7 years to 15 years. Senate Bill 354 also seeks to increase the fine for trafficking in 4 grams of more but less than 14 grams from \$50,000 to \$75,000.

Illicit fentanyl has plagued many communities throughout Florida as well as the entire United States. This dangerous drug is being illegally distributed throughout many communities causing devastating effects on the individuals within these communities. Unfortunately, many of these illegal distributions and trafficking of fentanyl ultimately result in the death of members in our communities. The effects fentanyl is having on our communities is detrimental. Offenders who choose to make the decision of trafficking fentanyl must face a severe consequence for committing this potentially deadly crime.

At least 18 Attorney Generals from different states joined Florida Attorney General Ashley Moody and Connecticut Attorney General William Tong in a bipartisan effort to urge President Joe Biden to classify illicit fentanyl as a weapon of mass destruction. In a news release from Attorney General Ashley Moody on September 15, 2022, it stated how more than 75,000 Americans died from overdose of synthetic opioids, mainly fentanyl, in the 12-month period preceding February 2022.\*1 Trafficking any amount of fentanyl has a severe impact on the community which is why
